Action Zambia Ministries (AZM) continues to move forward with the development of its core ministry areas.

Ciyanjano Centre for Christian Enrichment is slowly being developed for future ministry and will very soon be opening on a small scale to local churches. In August work was done to move the soccer field to an area more conducive for the community to use. This work was only recently completed by leveling the field and planting grass in time for the rainy season which should begin toward the end of October.

In conjunction with the PLD team, Tim took the 16 pastors from Action Pastor's College

(APC) on a "field trip" to Ciyanjano. There they were able to take a tour of the facilities. They were very encouraged and excited about the possibilities for their church leadership. November will be the first month for them to begin making weekend reservations.

Generous donors have given the money needed for AZM to begin plans for a 1.5 Kilometer, 16 strand electric fence. This fence will mark the perimeter of Ciyanjano and once up will allow us to commence camp-ground development.

We recently had the privilege of hosting a few members of Oikos, a church plant from

WA. This is the home church of the Huckabys who are raising support to join us next year. Tim was able to spend time showing them Ciyanjano and taking them to Chikankata.

In December, our team will hold its annual team retreat and planning out at Ciyanjano. We are looking forward to planning ministries and activities for the 2010 calendar year.

For our team retreat, Andrea's parents, Stan and Donna Armes will be taking us through some material called "Living in Grace". We are looking forward to this time together as a team and hope that God will continue to meld us together as one.

On the Home Front

Andrea is full steam into homeschooling but very glad that children begin in Kindergarten as she adjusts her schedule and life to fit around this new responsibility. She is taking Ireen through the Sonlight curriculum and enjoys their emphasis on a global worldview and missions.
